Our College at a Glance ...

- Originally named Shikshan Prasarak Mandal Mahavidyalaya (S.P.M. Mahavidyalaya in short) and housed in a building called the "Shree Krishna Bhuwan", the college was founded by a group of enthusiastic and education- loving local persons in 1961. Though the college had only Arts faculty in its year of foundation, another Commerce faculty was added in the very next year.
- In 1965 the college was shifted to its present building, donated by the Lokmanya Tilak Memorial Trust and college was renamed as Lokmanya Tilak Mahavidyalaya.
- In 1974 and 1975, the institution added two more feathers in its cap when the Science faculty and the Junior College unit were set up.
- During the academic session 1983-84 the Department of Pharmacy started functioning as a part of this institution. From 1991 onwards, the Department of Pharmacy started working independently as Institute of Pharmacy. In 1994 the college received a great honour when YCMOU, Nashik opened one of its study centers at our college.
- 2005 proved another memorable year in the history of our college since the Bangalore-based NAAC accorded a high grade (B+) to our institution and in 2018 NAAC awarded grade "B" to our institution in second cycle fo accreditation.
 - Furthermore, the Chemistry Laboratory of our college has been recognised by the Sant Gadge Baba Amravati University as a Research Centre where research scholars can pursue researches.
 - As per the recommendations of NAAC, an Internal Quality Assurance Cell has been set up to ensure the all-round development of our institution.
 - Last but not the least, the college with its spacious meeting hall, rich library, beautiful botanical garden, well-equipped laboratories, clean campus, experienced and dedicated teaching staff and huge number of students on its rolls continues its journey towards progress.



Rules of Admission:

- 1) For admission to the college, students will have to fill in admission forms which they can obtain from the college office by paying 50/- rupees. -: Anyone willing to have prospectus and application form by post will have to pay additional postal charges.
- To ensure admission students will have to submit their applications on or before due date declared by concerned authorities.
- 3) Students passing university level examinations and willing to seek admission to higher classes must submit their applications within TEN [10] days from the date of the declaration of results of University-level examinations failing which their applications will be rejected.
- 4) The following certificates, true copies should be attached to the application:
 - a) True copy of mark sheet
 - b) Original copy of School / College leaving certificate.
 - c) Caste certificate, Income certificate to claim scholarship, exemption from fees etc.
- 5) Before filling in application form for admission to a particular class, students must find out for. themselves whether they are eligible for admission to that class or not. Applications submitted by ineligible candidates will be immediately rejected. Filling in of application forms does not necessarily guarantee admission.
- 6) An incomplete or a defective application form will be rejected. Fee paid for such an application will <u>NOT</u> be refunded to the student.

If necessary, applicants will have to appear at an interview before an admission committee.

- Original certificates, their attested xerox copies and admission fees will be returned to students who are denied admission.
- 8) If a student requires attested xerox copy of the certificates submitted to the college, he/she will have to pay TWO Ruppes for every copy.
 - Necessary fees will have to be paid by a student before his / her confirmation of admission.



Post-admission Activities:

- a) Students must pay annual fees and submit properly filled in application forms along with necessary documents (for concessions, exemptions etc.) to the office within due dates. Anyone leaving the institution in midterm for some reason, will not be given the amount paid.
- b) Students must submit applications and fees for university enrolment within due dates.
- c) The students, belonging to categories approved by the government for grants, will be eligible for concession in fee and scholarship. All information related to the terms and condition laid down by the government regarding the above facilities can be sought from the office. These information will also be displayed on notice board from time to time.
- d) Caution money will be refunded to the students if he / she claims it within one year from the date of his/her leaving the college.
- e) Students from other University/Board must submit migration certificates at the time of admission.
 - Undergraduate students seeking admission to first year classes will not be allowed to change their optional subjects subsequently.

Examinations, Tests, etc.

Senior College:

Internal assessments of the students will be done as per university norms.

Junior College:

11th Class:

- 1) During the first academic session One Unit Test and One Half Yearly Test are held.
- During the second academic session One Unit Test and One Final Examination are conducted.
- 3) Oral Test is conducted after Final Examination.

12th Class:

- 1) During the first academic session One Unit Test and One Half Yearly Test are held.
- During the second academic session One Unit Test and One Final Examination are conducted.
- 3) Oral Test is conducted after Final Examination.

University/Higher Secondary Education Board Examination:

Students intending to appear at University and Higher Secondary Board Examinations must pay their examination fees before or on the scheduled date failing which they will not be allowed by the college authorities to appear at the said examinations.

Notices for Junior & Senior College Students:

Attending all the examinations/tests conducted by the institution is compulsory for the students. Any student absenting himself/herself from the entire examination or from a particular paper will be fined. Again, a student unable to appear at the examination because of his/her illness, will have to submit an application and a medical certificate from a registered medical practitioner to the Principal only **BEFORE** and not **AFTER** the examination.

Daily Attendance

Attending every period is compulsory for all the students. If a student fails to attend a period for some unavoidable reason/reasons, he/she will have to submit an application (containing a satisfactory explanation of his/her absence) to the authorities concerned. Every student will have to attend at least 75 % (Seventy five percent) of the total number of periods held in each academic session. Otherwise he/she will not be allowed to appear at the Board/University examination. Besides, he/she will not be given scholarships, concessions and other facilities. Regarding these issues, the Principal's decisions will be final.



Uniform and Identity Card

 Students will have to wear uniforms everyday except on Thursdays. But if the Independence Day, the Republic Day, etc. happen to fall on Thursdays and if the Principal issues a special order, they will have to wear their uniforms even on Thursdays.

Uniform for male students : Full-sleeved shirts and full trousers.

Uniform for female students : Salwar kameez and dupatta.

Samples of cloth for uniform will be displayed on the college notice board.

- As far as identity cards are concerned, students are supposed to collect them from the
 office, affix their own passport size photographs, fill in relevant information and obtain the
 Principal's signature thereon. In case a student loses his/her identity card, he/she can get a
 duplicate card by paying 100/- (Hundred) rupees.
- Students having no identity cards and uniforms will not be permitted to appear at examinations. Besides, they will be allowed neither to enter the library, reading room, laboratory, etc. nor to move around the college campus.

Notice Board

In their own interests students will have to keep an eye on the notice board since information about timetable, examinations, scholarships, various programmes, etc. will be provided on the college notice board.

Medical Examination

All the students of the institution will have to compulsorily undergo a medical examination conducted by a qualified doctor appointed by the college. (For Female students separate arrangements are made.) Anyone absenting himself / herself from the said examination, will be fined. Any student suffering from an infectious disease will be permitted to attend the college only after he/she obtains a medical certificate from a qualified doctor certifying his / her full recovery from that disease.

Parking Arrangement

Parking arrangement will be made by Shikshan Prasarak Mandal, Wani. The students will have to pay the cycle stand fee as per the notice displayed at the time of admission.

Incentive Marks

University awards ten marks (at the most) to such students as take part in N.C.C., N.S.S. activities, surveys, sports and various cultural programmes, blood donation, Home Guards etc. organized by and at the college / University.



Do's and don'ts for college students

- As soon as a lecturer/an honorable guest/an elderly person enters a classroom, students
 must not only stand up but also remain in that position, until the lecturer/the guest/the elderly
 person takes his/her seat.
- Students must enter their classrooms before the entry of lecturers. They can leave the classrooms, only when the lecturers allow/order them to do so.
- Students must not make a noise during the gap between two periods or during the tenminute-long recess.
- They must not loaf around in the corridors either.
- If they break/damage any college property, they will have to pay not only the original cost of the broken/damaged article, but also the fine levied thereon by the authorities.
- Students will be punished and fined if they are found guilty of damaging the college building, electricity and water supply systems, of breaking windowpanes of class-rooms or of writing vulgar, nonsensical things on walls and boards of classrooms.
- They must not enter the Principal's chamber or the staffroom without seeking the permission of the Principal or of the staff member.
- Students must behave properly and attend all the periods. If any student is absent from any
 period, he/she will have to pay fine for the entire day. While moving from one classroom to
 another students must maintain discipline.
- Even outside the college campus they must refrain from activities which harm the reputation
 of the college. Besides, they must not form any association, organization, etc. in the college
 and they must not invite any outsider to deliver speeches, lectures, etc. before them without
 the permission of the Principal. Of course, after securing the Principal's consent, they can
 call a responsible person to preside over programmes like debates, elocution contests,
 music competitions, etc.
- Students must not disclose any information about college management to any outsider.

Other important departments of the college

Library:

Our library has a fairly large collection not only of books (both text and reference books on a wide variety of subjects) but also of charts, maps, etc.

- 1. In the reading room newspapers, magazines (weekly, fortnightly and monthly) in Marathi, Hindi and English and subject-related journals are kept for the students.
- To avail oneself of the library facility, every student will have to get a library card. While a
 junior/senior college student can take home only one book at a time, a post-graduate student
 can take out two books at a time from the college library.
- 3. All the students must return their library books within ten days from the date of the issue of these books failing which they will be fined one rupee a day. In case the books are lost by anyone, the student will have to pay not only the price of the book but also the fine imposed thereon by the library authorities. Students should take out and return library books only during scheduled hours on scheduled days.
- Availability of NLIST at library. N-LIST is a project entitled National Library & Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content. It is a UGC-INFONET Digital Library Consortium which gives access to selected e-resources to our college.

Sports & Recreation Department

The college expects its students to excel in at least ONE game by making the best possible use of the adequate sports facilities provided in the institution.

- Students must attend the practice sessions held for different games, competitions, etc. failing which they will be punished by the department concerned. Besides, students must attend the medical check-up programme arranged every year by the department. Any student failing to attend the said medical test will be fined.
- 2. As far as the department of recreation is concerned, it not only provides the talented students with opportunities but also gives special awards, prizes, etc. to such students as excel in the said festival.

N.S.S.

The N.S.S. unit of the college undertakes various social service-oriented activities in rural and urban areas on holidays and during hours when routine academic activities are not performed mainly with a view to raising the students awareness of social responsibilities by exposing them to first-hand experiences of social service. Students' participation in social service camp or any other camp organized every year in rural areas by the college is compulsory. Students willing to participate in N.S.S. activities must register themselves with the teacher in charge of the department within the scheduled time-limit.



N.C.C.

The college N.C.C. unit seeks to inculcate discipline, patriotism, devotion to duty, leadership qualities, etc. in college students. The N.C.C. cadets get opportunities to participate in national/state-level camps organized from time to time by N.C.C. The Cadets get Refreshment/washing allowances upto Rs. 300/-. Cadets may apply for different scholarship. In various services vacancies are reserved for the N.C.C. cadets. N.C.C. helps in overall personality development of cadets. To secure admission to N.C.C., students will have to submit separate applications. (Full information about N.C.C. can be obtained from the college office.)

YCMOU Centre

The study centre of Yashwantarao Chauhan Maharashtra Open University which started functioning from the academic session 1994-95 onward, offers the following courses:

A) Preparatory Course:

Anyone attaining the age of eighteen (even if he or she is without any prior exposure to education) is eligible for admission to this course of three months' duration. On the successful completion of this academic programme, a student can seek admission to the first year in B.A. or B.Com.

B) B.A. / B.Com. (Marathi and English Medium) Courses:

The following categories of students are eligible for admission to the B.A./B.Com. Courses of Y.C.M.O.U.
